




POLICY

The College requires that research connected with the institution protect human subjects. To ensure that research is conducted ethically with benefits outweighing the risks to participants, researchers must submit proposals and documentation to an Institutional Review Board (IRB) before initiating any research project.

The IRB will review all proposed research involving human subjects to ensure their rights and welfare are protected and that participants are treated ethically. Proposals will be reviewed to determine whether or not they are exempt from review, require minimal risk to provide for expedited review or involve vulnerable populations requiring more than minimal risk. Proposals determined to require more than minimal risk will undergo a full review by the IRB in compliance with federal guidelines established by the Department of Health and Human Services (CFR Title 45, Part 46).
